The Institute for Education is **extending the deadline** for applications being received online for **The Football Parent/Guardian** commencing in **February 2023**. This course will be delivered face-to-face at the Institute for Education with the possibility of attending live streamed sessions.

The intention of the Football Parent Course (FPC) is to support the parent as an important stakeholder to be able to take care of his/her son/daughter within the environment of football. Various topics which can help the young footballer develop better will be discussed by relative experts in their area. In particular, long-term development, growth spurts and injuries, mental aspects, parental involvement, safeguarding, media, scouting and winning will be brought to the fore and examined in relation to the career of a young football player. These topics will create opportunities to share experiences between the animator and the parents and between the parents themselves generating a learning community which has a common interest – fostering the development of their own son/daughter.

A parent who acquires greater competences can be a positive role model for his/her son/daughter and will increase the chances of his/her son/daughter to reach the full potential. Yet, football is also about the process and the parent will learn how to value the journey of their son/daughter and together learn how they can develop lifetime experiences and lessons which they will treasure throughout their life. It is a great opportunity for bonding through the wonderful game of football, while ensuring that they are positive influences in their son/daughter's developmental pathway.



The FPC will be divided into 8 modules of 2½ hours each so that parents will have the opportunity to learn about aspects which could influence the player’s development through presentations, discussions, workshops and coffee breaks so that discussions are related to the experiences of each participant. This course does not have any formal assessments but is aimed to develop and refine parental/guardian skills that are required in football. A certificate of attendance will be awarded at the end of the course.
