The challenges posed by Malta's academic-oriented education system and limited outdoor spaces are examined, prompting a forward looking approach to transform school playgrounds into gardens. The aim is to support schools in providing children with more opportunities for exploration and learning in natural environments.

The presentation focuses on the importance of adapting educational practices to the evolving needs of students, drawing on the principles of Froebel and the national early childhood policies to create a more holistic and child-centred approach to education.
